### **Senate Bill 715**

1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new section,  
2 designated §5-10D-15, relating to personally identifiable information of a member, retirant,  
3 beneficiary, or alternate payee of a retirement system administered by the Consolidated  
4 Public Retirement Board being confidential and exempt from disclosure.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

**ARTICLE 10D. CONSOLIDATED PUBLIC RETIREMENT BOARD.**

**§5-10D-15. Confidential information exempt from disclosure.**

1 Due to the increased risk of fraud and personal identity theft, all information contained in  
2 the records maintained by the Consolidated Public Retirement Board for all retirement systems  
3 administered pursuant to this article that would tend to disclose personally identifiable information  
4 of a member, retirant, beneficiary or alternate payee are confidential and exempt from disclosure  
5 under the provisions of §29B-1-1 et seq. of this code. This information includes, without limitation,  
6 social security numbers, account numbers, dates of birth, addresses, telephone numbers, e-mail  
7 addresses, medical or disability information and direct deposit information. Members, retirants,  
8 beneficiaries, alternate payees, or persons authorized by them, are permitted access to their own  
9 information.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to exempt personally identifiable information of members, retirants, beneficiaries or alternate payees of a retirement system administered by CPRB from disclosure.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
