A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new section,
designated §19-36-7, relating to granting authority to the Department of Agriculture to
preempt any Department of Environmental Protection zoning laws, county or municipality
rules, for occasional agritourism activities so long as the activities adhere to the National
Fire Protection Association's Life Safety Code for occupant safety.
