1	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new article,
2	designated §16-4F-1, §16-4F-2, §16-4F-3, §16-4F-4, and §16-4F-5, relating to mandating
3	oversight, guidance, and support from the Office of Emergency Medical Services to county
4	commissions; establishing duties of Office of Emergency Medical Services; and providing
5	for implementation and reports to the Legislature.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 4F. WEST VIRGINIA EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES OVERSIGHT AND

SUPPORT ACT. §16-4F-1. Short title. 1 This Act shall be known as the "West Virginia Emergency Medical Services Oversight and 2 Support Act." §16-4F-2. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to ensure the efficient operation, accountability, and sustainability 1 2 of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) across the state by mandating oversight, guidance, and 3 support from the Office of Emergency Medical Services to county commissions. §16-4F-3. Duties of the Office of Emergency Medical Services. 1 (a) Structure and Guidance. — The Office of Emergency Medical Services shall: 2 (1) Develop and implement a standardized framework for county EMS operations; 3 (2) Provide guidance on best practices for staffing, resource allocation, and response 4 efficiency; and 5 (3) Assist county commissions in structuring their EMS services, including those operated 6 by volunteer fire departments. 7 (b) Auditing and Needs-Based Funding. — The Office of Emergency Medical Services 8 shall: 9 (1) Conduct financial audits of all county EMS services, including those affiliated with

10	volunteer fire departments, to ensure accountability and proper fund allocation;
11	(2) Distribute state EMS funding based on a needs-based assessment, prioritizing
12	counties with limited resources and high call volumes; and
13	(3) Establish financial reporting requirements for all EMS providers receiving state funds.
14	(c) Facility Inspections and Operational Audits. — The Office of Emergency Medical
15	Services shall:
16	(1) Conduct regular inspections of all EMS facilities, including those operated by county
17	commissions and volunteer fire departments, to ensure compliance with state and federal
18	standards;
19	(2) Audit operational procedures, equipment maintenance, and service readiness; and
20	(3) Provide corrective action plans and assistance for any facility found to be non-
21	compliant.
22	(d) Continuing Education and Training. — The Office of Emergency Medical Services shall:
23	(1) Oversee and coordinate continuing education programs for EMS personnel;
24	(2) Ensure that training programs meet state and national accreditation standards; and.
25	(3) Offer technical assistance to counties in developing local training programs.
26	(e) County Commission Assistance. — The Office of Emergency Medical Services shall:
27	(1) Serve as a direct resource for any county commission facing challenges in maintaining
28	or improving EMS services;
29	(2) Provide emergency operational support and recommendations for counties
30	experiencing EMS shortages or failures; and
31	(3) Facilitate partnerships between counties to improve regional EMS coverage and
32	response times.
	§16-4F-4. Implementation and Reporting.
1	On or before December 31, 2026, and annually thereafter, the Office of Emergency
2	Medical Services shall submit a report to the Legislature detailing:

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- 3 (1) The Office of Emergency Medical Services facility inspection results;
- 4 (2) Audit findings and financial assessments;
- 5 (3) Distribution of needs-based funding;
- 6 (4) Continuing education initiatives; and
- 7 (5) County commission assistance provided.
