1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new article, 2 designated §16-4G-1, §16-4G-2, §16-4G-3, §16-4G-4, §16-4G-5, §16-4G-6, §16-4G-7, 3 and §16-4G-8, relating to requiring needs-based assessments of emergency medical 4 services departments so that funding may be distributed according to need and not equally 5 across the board; providing short title; providing legislative findings; providing definitions; 6 providing process for implementation; providing for application of the assessment; 7 providing for reporting and legislative oversight; authorizing rulemaking to the Office of 8 Emergency Medical Services; and establishing an effective date.

	§16-4G-1.	Short	title.
1	This article shall be l	known and may be cited as the "Emergend	cy Medical Services Needs-
2	Based Assessment Act".		
	§16-4G-2.	Legislative	findings.
1	(a) The Legislature f	inds that emergency medical services (EM	1S) are a critical component
2	of public health and safety i	n West Virginia.	
3	(b) Disparities in fur	nding allocation have led to resource sho	ortages in high-need areas,
4	affecting response times an	d service quality.	
5	(c) A needs-based	assessment will provide a data-driven a	approach to ensuring EMS
6	funding is distributed equita	<u>bly.</u>	
	§16-4G-3.		Definitions.
1	For the purposes of	this act:	
2	(1) "Emergency Med	lical Services" or "EMS" refers to pre-hospi	tal emergency medical care

4	(2) "Needs-Based Assessment" refers to a comprehensive evaluation of EMS agencies to
5	determine funding requirements based on factors such as call volume, response times,
6	geographic coverage, and financial sustainability.
7	(3) "Department" refers to the West Virginia Department of Health, Bureau for Public
8	Health, Office of Emergency Medical Services.
	§16-4G-4. Needs-based assessment implementation.
1	(a) The department shall conduct a statewide EMS needs-based assessment every two
2	<u>years.</u>
3	(b) The assessment shall evaluate:
4	(1) Call volume and response times by jurisdiction;
5	(2) Availability of ambulances and trained personnel;
6	(3) Financial stability of EMS providers;
7	(4) Geographic challenges impacting service delivery;
8	(5) Mutual aid agreements and reliance on volunteer services; and
9	(6) Equipment and training deficiencies.
10	(c) The department shall collaborate with local EMS agencies, county commissions, and
11	regional health authorities in conducting the assessment.
12	(d) The first needs-based assessment shall be conducted within one year of the act's
13	passage.
	§16-4G-5. Needs-based funding application.
1	(a) The department shall establish a funding distribution formula based on the findings of
2	the needs-based assessment.
3	(b) Funding priority shall be given to EMS agencies demonstrating:
4	(1) High call volumes and slow response times;
5	(2) Financial instability that threatens operational viability;
6	(3) A shortage of certified personnel;

7	(4) Insufficient medical equipment or vehicles; and			
8	(5) Service coverage gaps in rural and underserved areas.			
9	(c) No EMS provider shall receive reduced funding unless justified by assessment findings			
10	and alternative funding availability.			
	§16-4G-6. Reporting; legislative oversight.			
1	(a) The department shall submit a report to the Legislature every two years detailing:			
2	(1) Assessment results;			
3	(2) Funding allocations and justifications;			
4	(3) Improvements and deficiencies in EMS services; and			
5	(4) Recommendations for legislative or regulatory changes.			
6	(b) The Joint Committee on Government and Finance shall review the report and make			
7	recommendations for policy adjustments if necessary.			
	§16-4G-7. Rulemaking.			
1	Pursuant to §29A-3-1 et seq. of this code, the department shall propose legislative rules to			
2	implement this act.			
	§16-4G-8. Effective date.			
1	This act shall be effective from passage.			
	NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to establish the Emergency Medical Services Needs-Based Assessment and Funding Act.
