1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new section, 2 designated §9-5-34, relating to the creation of the West Virginia Child First Advisory 3 Committee and the West Virginia Child First Fund; creating advisory committee; setting 4 forth composition of advisory committee; providing duties of advisory committee; providing 5 for minimum number of meetings; requiring annual findings and report; providing authority 6 to create subcommittees and working groups; establishing West Virginia Child First Fund; 7 providing for promulgation of rules; and providing for management of moneys within fund. Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 5. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

§9-5-34. Creation of the West Virginia Child First Advisory Committee and the West Virginia Child First Fund.

1	(a) There is hereby created the West Virginia Child First Advisory Committee, which shall
2	be administered by the Department of Human Services. The necessary expenses incurred by the
3	West Virginia Child First Advisory Committee shall be paid by the Department of Human Services.
4	(b) The West Virginia Child First Advisory Committee is comprised of the following
5	members:
6	(1) The Cabinet Secretary for the Department of Human Services, or his or her designee,
7	who shall also serve as the Chair of the Committee;
8	(2) The Foster Care Ombudsman, or his or her designee;
9	(3) Two individuals appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the
10	Senate, who have a background in child welfare issues, including, but not limited to, the following:
11	(A) Child abuse and neglect proceedings in West Virginia;
12	(B) Child welfare laws, rules, and regulations;
10	(O) The structure and workflow of the server energy of the shild wolfers suctors including

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- 13 (C) The structure and workflow of the components of the child welfare system, including,
- 14 but not limited to, abuse and neglect case intake, investigations into abuse and neglect

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15 allegations, case management, court processes, placement, reunification, and child permanency

16 plannings; and

- 17 (D) The permanent and temporary child placement system, including the child foster care
- 18 system, child placement process, and child adoption process;
- 19 (4) Two members of the West Virginia House of Delegates, ex officio non-voting,
- 20 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates;
- 21 (5) Two members of the West Virginia Senate, ex officio non-voting, appointed by the
- 22 <u>President of the Senate;</u>
- 23 (6) The Speaker of the House of Delegates, ex officio non-voting, or his or her designee;
- 24 (7) The President of the Senate, ex officio non-voting, or his or her designee; and
- 25 (8) The Administrative Director of the Supreme Court of Appeals, or his or her designee.
- 26 (c) The West Virginia Child First Committee shall:
- 27 (1) Evaluate child welfare outcomes in the state of West Virginia;
- 28 (2) Evaluate the potential improvement of child welfare outcomes in the state of West
- 29 <u>Virginia;</u>
- 30 (3) Evaluate the administration of child abuse and neglect laws including an evaluation of
- 31 the performance of judges, guardians ad litem and other attorneys representing children,

32 attorneys representing respondent parents, Child Protective Services workers, and Department

- 33 of Human Services administrators;
- 34 (4) Evaluate state child welfare laws, rules, and regulations;
- 35 (5) Evaluate areas of specific concern for children within the abuse and neglect court
- 36 system; and
- 37 (6) Identify the issues of priority and areas of most concern for the Department of Health
- 38 as it relates to the child welfare system;

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- 39 (d) The West Virginia Child First Advisory Committee shall meet at least guarterly and
- 40 shall make findings and annual recommendations contained in a report delivered to the Governor
- 41 and the Joint Committee on the Judiciary with respect to:
- 42 (1) Improving the child welfare system in West Virginia;
- 43 (2) Improving the permanent and temporary child placement system, including the child
- 44 foster care system, child placement process, and child adoption process;
- 45 (3) Opportunities for reducing the removal rate of children from parents and facilitating an
- 46 increase in the rates of family reunification outcomes;
- 47 (4) Opportunities for increased efficiency in the administration and delivery of child welfare
- 48 services that do not otherwise compromise child welfare outcomes;
- 49 (5) Opportunities for increasing transparency and accountability within the child welfare
- 50 system; and
- 51 (6) Any other opportunities for legislative or executive action that could address, resolve,
- 52 or otherwise improve upon any problem identified including, but not limited to, the following:
- 53 (A) Mapping the structure and workflow of all major components of the child welfare
- 54 system, including intake, investigation, case management, court processes, placement,
- 55 reunification, and permanency plannings;
- 56 (B) Identifying duplication of efforts, unnecessary complexity, communication
- 57 breakdowns, and other operational inefficiencies across agencies and stakeholder groups;
- 58 (C) Evaluating the alignment of information systems and data infrastructure to support
- 59 efficient service delivery and accountability;
- 60 (D) Analyzing the system's ability to provide predictable, timely, and high-quality services
- 61 to children and families, using metrics such as decision timelines, placement stability, and
- 62 <u>reunification rates;</u>
- 63 (E) Assessing opportunities for cross-agency coordination, integration of services, and
- 64 modernization of workflows through technology or policy innovation; and

- 65 (F) Providing a framework for continuous quality improvement using principles of systems
- 66 design, performance feedback, and organizational development.
- 67 (e) The West Virginia Child First Advisory Committee shall deliver its annual report
- 68 containing the required findings and recommendations to the Governor and the Joint Committee
- 69 on the Judiciary on or before January 1 of each year, beginning January 2026.
- 70 (f) The West Virginia Child First Advisory Committee may create subcommittees and
- 71 working groups it considers appropriate.
- 72 (g) The West Virginia Child First Fund is hereby established and shall be administered by
- 73 the Department of Human Services. The Department of Human Services shall promulgate rules
- 74 for purposes of administering this fund.
- 75 (1) Expenditures from the West Virginia Child First Fund shall be used for the sole purpose
- 76 of improving child welfare outcomes in the state of West Virginia.
- 77 (2) The West Virginia Child First Fund shall consist of moneys that may be appropriated
- 78 by the Legislature, moneys received from the federal government, and moneys received from
- 79 private donations, grants, bequests, and all other moneys received from all sources. The
- 80 Department of Human Services, political subdivisions, and any private entity may engage in
- 81 <u>fundraising efforts to solicit donations to the West Virginia Child First Fund.</u>
- 82 (3) Any moneys remaining in the West Virginia Child First Fund at the end of the fiscal
- 83 year shall not revert to the General Revenue Fund but shall remain in the fund solely for the
- 84 purpose stated in this article.
- 85 (4) The moneys accrued in the West Virginia Child First Fund, any earnings thereon, and
- 86 any yields from investments by the Treasurer or West Virginia Investment Management Board
- 87 are reserved solely and exclusively for the purposes set forth in this subsection.
