1 A BILL to amend and reenact §17-5-1 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to
 2 the state convict road force; making all inmates, regardless of sex, eligible to work on a
 3 state convict road force; and providing no road crew be mixed sex.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 5. STATE CONVICT ROAD FORCE.

§17-5-1. State convict road force; how used.

1 All ~~male~~ persons convicted of a felony and, sentenced to imprisonment or confinement in
 2 ~~the penitentiary~~ a correctional facility by any court, or who may hereafter be sentenced for a felony,
 3 whether actually sentenced to labor or not, or so many thereof as may be required by the state
 4 road commissioner, shall, as incident to such sentence or confinement, constitute the state convict
 5 road force and as such may be employed under the supervision of the state road commissioner in
 6 building, surfacing and maintaining roads under the supervision of the state road commissioner,
 7 including all roads in the state road system, and in and about any quarries, gravel pits, sandbanks,
 8 crushers, brick kilns, or other plants and places operated by the state road commission for the
 9 manufacture and acquisition of materials for use in the construction, maintenance and repair of
 10 such roads: Provided, That no road crew assembled under this article shall be composed of both
 11 male and female persons.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit female inmates to become members of the state convict road force.
