1 AN ACT to amend and reenact §64-9-1 *et seq.* of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,  
2 relating to authorizing certain miscellaneous agencies and boards to promulgate  
3 legislative rules; authoring the rules as filed, as amended, and as modified by the  
4 Legislative Rule-Making Review Committee, and as amended by the Legislature; directing  
5 certain miscellaneous agencies and boards to repeal current legislative rules; authorizing  
6 the Department of Agriculture to promulgate a legislative rule relating to registration forms  
7 and tags for registration, taxation, and control of dogs; authorizing the Department of  
8 Agriculture to promulgate a legislative rule relating to grades and standards for apples;  
9 authorizing the Department of Agriculture to promulgate a legislative rule relating to public  
10 markets; authorizing the Department of Agriculture to promulgate a legislative rule relating  
11 to the licensing of livestock dealers; authorizing the Department of Agriculture to  
12 promulgate a legislative rule relating to Grade A pasteurized milk; authorizing the

**ARTICLE 9. AUTHORIZATION FOR MISCELLANEOUS BOARDS AND AGENCIES
