1 A BILL to amend and reenact §17-16D-14 and §17A-4-1 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as
2 amended, relating to single fee discount plans; and requiring the Division of Motor Vehicles
3 to update the Parkways Authority when a person who uses the single fee discount plan
4 updates their vehicle information.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 16D. ELECTRONIC TOLL COLLECTION.

§17-16D-14. Rule-making authority.

1 (a) The Commissioner of Motor Vehicles and the Parkways Authority shall propose rules
2 for legislative approval in accordance with the provisions of 29A-3-1 *et seq.* of this code to
3 implement this article.

4 (b) The Parkways Authority and the division shall create a procedure according to which
5 the division shall provide the Parkways Authority updated information when any person utilizing
6 the single fee discount plan updates the registration information of a vehicle registered in this
7 state. The Parkways Authority and the division shall jointly propose rules for legislative approval in
8 accordance with §29A-3-1 *et seq.* of this code to implement this program.

ARTICLE 4. TRANSFERS OF TITLE OR INTEREST.

**§17A-4-1. Registration expires on transfer by owner; transfer, surrender or retention of
plates.**

1 (a) Whenever the owner of a registered vehicle transfers or assigns his or her title, or
2 interest thereto, the registration of such vehicle shall expire: *Provided*, That such owner, if he or
3 she has made application to the department within sixty 60 days from the date of purchase to have
4 said registration plates transferred to be used on another vehicle owned by said owner, may then
5 operate the other vehicle for a period of sixty 60 days, but in no event longer than sixty 60 days
6 from the date of original transfer. Upon such transfer, it shall be the duty of the original owner to
7 retain the registration plates issued therefor and to immediately notify the commissioner of such

8 transfer upon such form as may be provided therefor and to deliver to him or her the certificate of
9 registration, whereupon the commissioner shall, upon the payment of a fee of \$10, issue a new
10 certificate showing the use to be made of such plates. The Division of Motor Vehicles may adjust
11 the fee for each new certificate every five years on September 1, based on the U. S. Department of
12 Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics most current Consumer Price Index: *Provided*, That an increase
13 in such fee may not exceed 10 percent of the total fee amount in a single year. Such plates may
14 then be used by such owner on another vehicle of the same class as the vehicle for which they
15 were originally issued if such other vehicle does not require a greater license fee than was
16 required for such original vehicle. If such other vehicle requires a greater license fee than such
17 original vehicle, then such plates may be used by paying such difference to the commissioner.
18 When such transfer of ownership is made to a licensed dealer in motor vehicles it shall be the duty
19 of such dealer to immediately execute notification of transfer, in triplicate, and to have this
20 notification properly signed by the owner making the transfer. The dealer shall immediately
21 forward to the department the original copy of the notification of transfer. One copy of the
22 notification of transfer shall be given to the owner and one shall be retained by the dealer. The
23 owner shall immediately send to the department the transfer fee of \$10 with any additional fee that
24 may be required under the terms of this chapter. The owner's copy, properly signed by the dealer,
25 will be the owner's identification until he or she receives a new registration card from the
26 department.

27 (b) The owner of a set of registration plates may surrender them to the commissioner
28 together with the registration card and, upon the payment of \$10 as an exchange fee and upon the
29 payment of such additional fees as are necessary to equalize the value of the plates surrendered
30 with the value of registration plates desired, receive in exchange a set of plates and registration
31 card for a vehicle of a different class.

32 (c) The Parkways Authority and the division shall create a procedure according to which
33 the division shall provide the Parkways Authority updated information when any person utilizing

34 the single fee discount plan updates the registration information of a vehicle registered in this

35 state.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to streamline the process of updating a driver's information when getting a new vehicle and using EZ-Pass.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
