1 A BILL to amend and reenact §30-10-1, §30-10-3, §30-10-4, §30-10-5, §30-10-6, §30-10-8, §30-
2 10-9, §30-10-10, §30-10-11, §30-10-12, §30-10-13, §30-10-14, §30-10-15, §30-10-16,
3 §30-10-17, §30-10-18, §30-10-19, §30-10-20, §30-10-21, §30-10-22, and §30-10-24 of
4 the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating generally to practice of veterinary
5 medicine; defining terms; editing powers and duties of the Board of Veterinary Medicine;
6 amending licensing requirements; changing scope of practice of veterinarians, veterinary
7 technicians, and certified animal euthanasia technicians; amending requirements for
8 veterinary technicians and certified animal euthanasia technicians; providing for
9 temporary permits for veterinarians and veterinary technicians; setting exemptions;
10 altering display of license requirements; increasing penalties; updating telehealth practice;
11 providing reciprocity for veterinarians and veterinary technicians who are licensed in other
12 states to practice veterinary medicine; providing process and requirements for reciprocal
13 license; and making technical corrections throughout.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 10. VETERINARIANS.

§30-10-1. Unlawful acts.

1 ~~(a) It is unlawful for any person to practice or offer to practice veterinary medicine,~~
2 ~~veterinary technology or animal euthanasia in this state without a license, registration or certificate~~
3 ~~issued under the provisions of this article, or advertise or use any title or description tending to~~
4 ~~convey the impression that they are a veterinarian, veterinary technician or animal euthanasia~~
5 ~~technician unless such person has been duly licensed, registered or certified under the provisions~~
6 ~~of this article. The practice of veterinary medicine, veterinary technology, or animal euthanasia in~~
7 ~~this jurisdiction is subject to enforcement by the board. Except as otherwise provided in this article,~~
8 ~~it shall be unlawful for any person to practice veterinary medicine, veterinary technology, or animal~~
9 ~~euthanasia in this jurisdiction through any means unless duly licensed, registered, or certified~~
10 ~~under the applicable provisions of this article.~~

11 (b) No person may use the designation veterinarian, licensed veterinarian, registered
12 veterinary telehealth practitioner, or any other designation indicating licensure or registration
13 status, including abbreviations, or hold themselves out as a veterinarian unless duly licensed or
14 registered as such.

15 (c) No person may use the designation veterinary technician, registered veterinary
16 technician, or any other designation indicating registration status, including abbreviations, or hold
17 themselves out as a veterinary technician unless duly registered as such.

18 (d) No person may use the designation animal euthanasia technician, certified animal
19 euthanasia technician, or any other designation indicating certification status, including
20 abbreviations, or hold themselves out as an animal euthanasia technician, unless duly certified
21 as such.

22 (e) Whenever the board or other interested person believes that any person has engaged,
23 is engaging, or is about to engage in any act that constitutes a violation of this article, the board
24 or other interested person may make application to any court of competent jurisdiction for an order
25 enjoining the acts or services.

26 (f) Whenever the board, its executive director, or its authorized representative has reason
27 to believe that any person has knowingly violated a provision of this article, the board, its executive
28 director, or its authorized representative may bring the relevant information to the prosecuting
29 attorney in the county where the violation has occurred.

30 (g) Whenever any other interested person has reason to believe that any person has
31 knowingly violated a provision of this article, such person may bring the relevant information to
32 the attention of the appropriate law-enforcement officer who may cause an investigation to be
33 made in order for appropriate criminal proceedings to be brought.

34 (h) Nothing in this article shall be construed to prevent members of other professions from
35 performing functions for which they are duly licensed. Such other professionals may not hold
36 themselves out or refer to themselves by any title or description stating or implying that they are

37 licensed or otherwise entitled to practice veterinary medicine, veterinary technology, or animal
38 euthanasia.

39 (b) (i) A business entity may not render any service or engage in any activity which, if
40 rendered or engaged in by an individual, would constitute the practice of veterinary medicine,
41 veterinary technology, or animal euthanasia, except through a licensee, registrant, or ~~certificate~~
42 ~~holder~~ certificant.

§30-10-3. Definitions.

1 As used in this article, the following words and terms have the following meanings:

2 (a) "Animal" means any animal, living or dead, other than human, ~~and the term includes~~
3 ~~fowl, birds, amphibians, fish, and reptiles, wild or domestic, living or dead.~~

4 (b) "Animal ~~control~~ euthanasia facility" means a municipal or county operated humane
5 society or animal shelter incorporated and organized under the laws of this state, or a humane
6 society or an animal shelter classified as 501(c)(3) by the Internal Revenue Service, with at least
7 one certified animal euthanasia technician.

8 (c) "Applicant" means a person making an application for a license, certificate, registration,
9 or permit, under the provisions of this article.

10 (d) "Board" means the West Virginia Board of Veterinary Medicine.

11 (e) "Business entity" means any firm, partnership, association, company, corporation,
12 limited partnership, limited liability company, or other entity performing veterinary medicine,
13 veterinary technology, or animal euthanasia.

14 "Certificant" means a person holding a certificate issued under the provisions of this article.

15 (f) "Certificate" means an animal euthanasia technician certificate issued under the
16 provisions of this article.

17 (g) ~~"Certificate holder" means a person holding a certificate issued under the provisions~~
18 ~~of this article.~~

19 ~~(h)~~ "Certified animal euthanasia technician" means a person who is certified by the board
20 to euthanize animals in accordance with the provisions of this article.

21 ~~(i)~~ "General supervision" means the supervising veterinarian is ~~in the building~~ on the
22 premises where the animal is being treated, has given instructions for treatment, and is quickly
23 and easily available.

24 ~~(j)~~ "Indirect supervision" means ~~the performance of procedures on the orders of a~~
25 supervising veterinarian need not be on the premises but has given either written or oral
26 instructions for the treatment of the patient and is readily available for communication or is
27 providing telehealth services.

28 "Interstate telehealth services" means the provision of telehealth services to a patient
29 located in West Virginia by a registered veterinary care professional located in any other state or
30 commonwealth of the United States.

31 ~~(k)~~ "License" means a veterinary medicine license issued under the provisions of this
32 article.

33 ~~(l)~~ "Licensee" means a person holding a license issued under the provisions of this article.

34 ~~(m)~~ "Permit" means a temporary permit to practice veterinary medicine or veterinary
35 technology issued by the board.

36 ~~(n)~~ "Permittee" means a person holding a permit issued under the provisions of this article.

37 "Person" means any individual, firm, partnership, association, joint venture, cooperative,
38 corporation, governmental body, or any other group, legal entity, or combination acting in concert;
39 and whether or not acting as a principal, trustee, fiduciary, receiver, or as any kind of legal or
40 personal representative, or as the successor in interest, assignee, agent, factor, servant,
41 employee, director, officer, or any other representative of such person.

42 "Personal examination" is a face to face, in-person, examination of the patient.

43 ~~(o)~~ "Practice of veterinary medicine" means to diagnose, treat, correct, change, relieve, or
44 prevent any disease, deformity, defect, injury, or other physical or mental condition, of any animal,

45 or to prescribe for or to administer to any animal any drug, medicine, biologic, apparatus,
46 application, anesthetic, or other therapeutic or diagnostic substance or technique, or to render
47 advice or any recommendation with respect to any of the foregoing.

48 ~~(p) "Practice of veterinary technology" means the science and art of providing all aspects~~
49 ~~of professional medical care, services and treatment for animals with the exceptions of diagnosis,~~
50 ~~prognosis, surgery, prescription and application of any treatments, drugs, medications or~~
51 ~~appliances, where a valid veterinarian-client-patient relationship exists.~~

52 (q) "Registered veterinary technician" means a person who is duly registered to practice
53 veterinary technology under the provisions of this article.

54 (r) "Registrant" means a person or facility holding a registration issued under the
55 provisions of this article.

56 (s) "Registration" means a veterinary technician registration, a veterinary telehealth
57 practitioner registration, veterinary facility registration, or an animal euthanasia facility registration
58 issued under the provisions of this article.

59 (t) "Supervising veterinarian" means a veterinarian, licensed under this article, who
60 assumes responsibility for the professional care given to an animal by a person authorized by this
61 article to work under his or her general or indirect supervision.

62 "Telehealth services" means the use of synchronous or asynchronous
63 telecommunications technology or audio-only telephone calls by a veterinary care professional to
64 provide veterinary care services, including, but not limited to, assessment, diagnosis,
65 consultation, treatment, and monitoring of a patient; transfer of medical data; patient and
66 professional health-related education; public health services; and health administration. The term
67 does not include internet questionnaires, e-mail messages, or facsimile transmissions.

68 (u) "Veterinarian" means a person who is licensed to practice veterinary medicine under
69 the provisions of this article.

70 ~~(v)~~ "Veterinary assistant" means a person who has not met the requirements for becoming
71 a registered veterinary technician. The duties and tasks of a veterinary assistant are instructed
72 from and ~~directly supervised by~~ under general supervision of a licensed veterinarian, who is
73 accountable for the veterinary assistant's actions. The supervising veterinarian is responsible for
74 determining the ability and competence of the veterinary assistant to perform the directed task or
75 procedure.

76 ~~(w)~~ "Veterinarian-client-patient relationship" or VCPR means a relationship between a
77 veterinarian, a client, and a patient, and exists when:

78 (1) A veterinarian assumes responsibility for medical judgments regarding the health of an
79 animal and the client who is the owner or other caretaker of the animal agrees to follow the
80 veterinarian's instructions; ~~or and~~

81 (2) A veterinarian, through personal examination of an animal or a representative sample
82 of a herd or flock, obtains sufficient information to make at least a general or preliminary diagnosis
83 of the medical condition of the animal, herd, or flock, which diagnosis is expanded through
84 medically appropriate visits to the premises where the animal, herd, or flock is kept.

85 ~~(3) A veterinarian may, without an established VCPR, provide consultation services,~~
86 ~~including the review and evaluation of an animal's condition, medical information, and diagnostic~~
87 ~~tests, on behalf of a buyer or seller; however, such consultation may not include the treatment of,~~
88 ~~or prescribing to, the animal.~~

89 "Veterinary care professional" means the official authorization by the board to engage in
90 the practice of veterinary medicine or veterinary technology.

§30-10-4. Board of Veterinary Medicine.

1 (a) The West Virginia Board of Veterinary Medicine is continued. The members of the
2 board in office on July 1, 2010, shall, unless sooner removed, continue to serve until their
3 respective terms expire and until their successors have been appointed and qualified.

4 (b) Prior to July 1, 2010, the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate,
5 shall appoint:

6 (1) A registered veterinary technician for a term of five years; and

7 (2) A licensed veterinarian for a term of four years.

8 (c) Commencing July 1, 2010, the board shall consist of the following nine members,
9 appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senate:

10 (1) Six members licensed to practice veterinary medicine in this state, at least one of which
11 shall be a large animal veterinarian;

12 (2) One member registered to practice veterinary technology in this state; and

13 (3) Two citizen members, who are not licensed, registered, certified, or permitted under
14 the provisions of this article, and who do not perform any services related to the practice of the
15 professions regulated under the provisions of this article.

16 (d) After the initial appointment term, the appointment term is five years. A member may
17 not serve more than two consecutive terms. A member who has served two consecutive full terms
18 may not be reappointed for at least one year after completion of his or her second full term. A
19 member may continue to serve until his or her successor has been appointed and qualified.

20 (e) Each licensed or registered member of the board, at the time of his or her appointment,
21 must have held a license or registration in this state for a period of not less than three years
22 immediately preceding the appointment.

23 (f) Each member of the board must be a resident of this state during the appointment term.

24 (g) A vacancy on the board shall be filled by appointment by the Governor for the
25 unexpired term of the member whose office is vacant.

26 (h) The Governor may remove any member from the board for neglect of duty,
27 incompetency, or official misconduct.

28 (i) A licensed or registered member of the board immediately and automatically forfeits
29 membership to the board if his or her license or registration to practice is suspended or revoked.

30 (j) A member of the board immediately and automatically forfeits membership to the board
31 if he or she is convicted of a felony under the laws of any jurisdiction or becomes a nonresident
32 of this state.

33 (k) The board shall elect annually one of its members as chairperson and one member as
34 secretary-treasurer who shall serve at the will and pleasure of the board.

35 (l) Each member of the board is entitled to receive compensation and expense
36 reimbursement in accordance with article one of this chapter.

37 (m) A majority of the members of the board constitutes a quorum.

38 (n) A veterinary technician member may not be employed by a veterinarian on the board.

39 (o) The board shall hold at least one annual meeting. Other meetings shall be held at the
40 call of the chairperson or upon the written request of three members, at the time and place as
41 designated in the call or request.

42 (p) Prior to commencing his or her duties as a member of the board, each member shall
43 take and subscribe to the oath required by section five, article four of the Constitution of this state.

§30-10-5. Powers and duties of the board.

1 The board has all the powers and duties set forth in this article, by rule, in §30-1-1 *et seq.*
2 of this code and elsewhere in law, including to:

3 (1) Hold meetings, conduct hearings, and administer examinations;

4 (2) Establish requirements for a license, permit, certificate, and registration;

5 (3) Establish procedures for submitting, approving, and rejecting applications for a license,
6 permit, certificate, and registration;

7 (4) Determine the qualifications of any applicant for a license, permit, certificate, and
8 registration;

9 (5) Establish the fees charged under the provisions of this article;

10 (6) Issue, renew, deny, suspend, revoke, or reinstate a license, permit, certificate, and
11 registration;

12 (7) Prepare, ~~conduct~~, administer, and grade written, oral, or ~~written and oral~~ online
13 examinations for a license, certificate, and registration;

14 (8) Determine the passing grade for the examinations;

15 (9) Contract with third parties to administer the examinations required under the provisions
16 of this article;

17 (10) Maintain records of the examinations the board or a third party administers, including
18 the number of persons taking the examination and the pass and fail rate;

19 (11) Maintain an office, and hire, discharge, establish the job requirements, and fix the
20 compensation of employees, and contract with persons necessary to enforce the provisions of
21 this article;

22 (12) Investigate alleged violations of the provisions of this article, legislative rules, orders,
23 and final decisions of the board;

24 (13) Conduct disciplinary hearings of persons regulated by the board;

25 (14) Determine disciplinary action and issue orders;

26 (15) Institute appropriate legal action for the enforcement of the provisions of this article;

27 (16) Maintain an accurate registry of names and addresses of all persons regulated by the
28 board;

29 (17) Keep accurate and complete records of its proceedings, and certify the same as may
30 be necessary and appropriate;

31 (18) Establish, by legislative rule, the continuing education requirements for licensees,
32 permittees, ~~certificate holders~~ certificants, and registrants;

33 (19) Provide free or for fee continuing education programs for licensees, permittees,
34 certificants, and registrants;

35 ~~(19)~~ (20) Propose rules in accordance with the provisions of §29A-3-1 *et seq.* of this code
36 to implement the provisions of this article;

37 ~~(20)~~ (21) Sue and be sued in its official name as an agency of this state;

38 ~~(24)~~ (22) Confer with the Attorney General or his or her assistant in connection with legal
39 matters and questions; and

40 ~~(22)~~ (23) Take all other actions necessary and proper to effectuate the purposes of this
41 article.

§30-10-6. Rule-making authority.

1 (a) The board shall propose rules for legislative approval, in accordance with the
2 provisions of §29A-3-1 *et seq.* of this code, to implement the provisions of this article, including:

3 (1) Standards and requirements for a license, permit, certificate, and registration;

4 (2) Educational and experience requirements;

5 (3) Procedures for examinations and reexaminations;

6 (4) Requirements for third parties to prepare, administer, or prepare and administer
7 examinations and reexaminations;

8 (5) The passing grade on the examination;

9 (6) Standards for approval of courses;

10 (7) Establish a certified animal euthanasia technician's program;

11 (8) Procedures for the issuance and renewal of a license, permit, certificate, and
12 registration;

13 (9) A fee schedule;

14 (10) Continuing education requirements;

15 (11) Set standards for ethical conduct;

16 (12) Establish procedures and requirements for facility inspections;

17 (13) Clarify the veterinarian-client-patient relationship;

18 (14) The procedures for denying, suspending, revoking, reinstating, or limiting the practice
19 of a licensee, permittee, ~~certificate holder~~ certificiant, or registrant;

20 (15) Requirements for a revoked license, permit, certificate, and registration; and

21 (16) Any other rules necessary to effectuate the provisions of this article.

22 (b) All of the board's rules in effect on July 1, 2010, shall remain in effect until they are
23 amended, modified, repealed, or replaced.

**§30-10-8. Requirements for ~~Veterinary License~~ veterinary license or veterinary telehealth
practitioner registration.**

1 (a) To be eligible for a license or registration to practice veterinary medicine under the
2 provisions of this article, the applicant must:

3 ~~(1) Be of good moral character;~~

4 ~~(2) (A) Be a graduate of~~ (1) Have a degree from an American Veterinary Medical
5 Association (AVMA)-accredited school approved by the board; or hold a certificate of educational
6 equivalence issued by an AVMA or American Association of Veterinary State Boards (AAVSB)
7 foreign/international veterinary program;

8 ~~(B) Be a graduate of a foreign veterinary school and hold a certificate of competence~~
9 ~~issued by a foreign veterinary graduate educational organization as approved by the board;~~

10 ~~(3)~~ (2) Have passed the examinations required by the board;

11 ~~(4)~~ (3) Be at least 18 years of age;

12 ~~(5)~~ (4) Be a citizen of the United States or be eligible for employment in the United States;

13 ~~(6) Not have been convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude~~

14 ~~(5)~~ (5) Pass the prescribed criminal background check;

15 ~~(7)~~ (6) Not have been convicted of a misdemeanor or felony that bears a rational nexus to
16 the practice of veterinary medicine under the laws of any jurisdiction within five years preceding
17 the date of application for licensure which conviction remains unreversed; and

18 ~~(8)~~ (7) Not have been convicted of a misdemeanor or a felony under the laws of any
19 jurisdiction at any time if the offense for which the applicant was convicted related to the practice
20 of veterinary medicine or animal abuse, or neglect, violence, or of a sexual nature to a human or
21 animal.

22 (b) A person seeking a license under the provisions of this article shall submit an
23 application on a form prescribed by the board and pay all applicable fees.

24 (c) An applicant from another jurisdiction shall comply with all the requirements of this
25 article or, if applicable, may proceed pursuant to the provisions of §30-1-27 of this code: *Provided,*
26 That the board may issue a license to an applicant who holds and, for the five years immediately
27 preceding the submission of his or her application, has held an active license, or similar credential,
28 in good standing to practice veterinary medicine in a state, district, or territory of the United States
29 that has licensure requirements that are substantially equivalent to the requirements of this article,
30 and who avers that his or her license has never been suspended or revoked as a result of a
31 disciplinary action in any state, district, or territory in which he or she has held a license to practice
32 as veterinary medicine: *Provided, however,* That the board may require by rule, promulgated
33 pursuant to §29A-3-1 *et seq.*, that an applicant must provide a letter of good standing or other
34 documentation demonstrating that his or her license has never been suspended or revoked as a
35 result of a disciplinary action in each state, district, or territory where he or she holds and has held
36 a license.

37 (d) A license to practice veterinary medicine issued by the board prior to July 1, 2010, shall
38 for all purposes be considered a license issued under this article and may be renewed under this
39 article.

40 (e) An application for a license to practice veterinary medicine submitted to the board prior
41 to July 1, 2010, shall be considered in conformity with the licensing provisions of this article and
42 the rules promulgated thereunder in effect at the time of the submission of the application.

**§30-10-9. Scope of practice for a licensed veterinarian or registered veterinary telehealth
practitioner.**

1 A person licensed or registered to practice veterinary medicine may do the following:

2 (a) Prescribe or administer any drug, medicine, treatment, method, or practice for an
3 animal.

4 (b) Perform any operation or manipulation on, or apply any apparatus or appliance to, an
5 animal.

6 (c) Give instruction or demonstration for the cure, amelioration, correction, ~~or~~ reduction, or
7 modification of an animal condition, disease, deformity, defect, wound, or injury.

8 (d) Diagnose or prognosticate an animal condition, disease, deformity, defect, wound, or
9 injury ~~for hire, fee, reward, or compensation that is directly or indirectly promised, offered,~~
10 ~~expected, received, or accepted.~~

11 (e) Prescribe or administer any legally authorized drug, medicine, treatment, method, or
12 practice; perform any operation or manipulation; or apply any apparatus or appliance for the cure,
13 amelioration, correction, or modification of an animal condition, disease, deformity, defect, wound,
14 or injury ~~for hire, fee, compensation, or reward that is directly or indirectly promised, offered,~~
15 ~~expected, received, or accepted.~~

16 (f) A veterinarian who provides emergency treatment (in a manner the veterinarian
17 determines appropriate in accordance with the "Principles of Veterinary Medical Ethics" of the
18 American Veterinary Medical Association) to an ill or injured animal on the veterinarian's own
19 initiative (if the owner is not present or able to be reached via electronic means), or at the request
20 of a person other than the animal's owner, is not liable to the owner for damages to the animal
21 unless the veterinarian commits gross negligence or violates any current law.

22 (1) The veterinarian may perform euthanasia based on the examination of the animal
23 and is performing the humane act necessary to relieve the animal's pain and suffering if present.

24 (2) For each animal treated, euthanized, or disposed of, the veterinarian and veterinary
25 facility shall maintain a record that contains:

26 (A) All legal requirements set forth in this article and related rules and in addition:

27 (B) A physical description of the animal, which may include, without limitation, a
28 photograph;

29 (C) The date the animal was delivered to the veterinarian or at the veterinary facility;

30 (D) A description of the attempts made by the veterinarian or veterinary facility to contact
31 the owner, if applicable;

32 (E) A list of any treatments or care provided by the veterinarian or veterinary facility; and

33 (F) A description of how the animal was disposed of after a euthanasia, if applicable, or if
34 the animal died naturally, along with the date.

§30-10-10. Requirements for a registered veterinary technician.

1 (a) To be eligible for a registration to practice veterinary technology under the provisions
2 of this article, the applicant must:

3 ~~(1) Be of good moral character;~~

4 ~~(2) (1) Have a degree in veterinary technology from an accredited school, approved by the~~
5 ~~board~~ from an AVMA-accredited veterinary technology program or hold a certificate of educational
6 equivalence issued by an AVMA or AAVSB foreign/international veterinary technology graduate
7 education program;

8 ~~(3) (2) Have passed the examinations required by the board;~~

9 ~~(4) (3) Be at least 18 years of age;~~

10 ~~(5) (4) Be a citizen of the United States or be eligible for employment in the United States;~~

11 ~~(6) Not have been convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude~~

12 ~~(5) Pass the prescribed criminal background check;~~

13 ~~(7) (6) Not have been convicted of a misdemeanor or felony that bears rational nexus to~~
14 the practice of veterinary technology under the laws of any jurisdiction within five years preceding
15 the date of application for registration which conviction remains unreversed; and

16 ~~(8) (7) Not have been convicted of a misdemeanor or a felony under the laws of any~~
17 jurisdiction at any time if the offense for which the applicant was convicted related to ~~the practice~~
18 of veterinary technology or animal abuse or neglect, violence, or of a sexual nature to a human
19 or animal.

20 (b) A person seeking registration under the provisions of this article shall submit an
21 application on a form prescribed by the board and pay all applicable fees.

22 (c) A person registered to practice veterinary technology issued by the board prior to July
23 1, 2010, shall for all purposes be considered registered under this article and may renew pursuant
24 to the provisions of this article.

25 (d) An applicant from another jurisdiction shall comply with all the requirements of this
26 section: *Provided*, That the board may issue a license to an applicant who holds and, for the five
27 years immediately preceding the submission of his or her application, has held an active license,
28 or similar credential, in good standing to practice veterinary technology in a state, district, or
29 territory of the United States that has licensure requirements that are substantially equivalent to
30 the requirements of this article, and who avers that his or her license has never been suspended
31 or revoked as a result of a disciplinary action in any state, district, or territory in which he or she
32 has held a license to practice as veterinary technology: *Provided, however*, That the board may
33 require by rule, promulgated pursuant to §29A-3-1 *et seq.*, that an applicant must provide a letter
34 of good standing or other documentation demonstrating that his or her license has never been
35 suspended or revoked as a result of a disciplinary action in each state, district, or territory where
36 he or she holds and has held a license.

§30-10-11. Scope of practice for registered veterinary technician.

18 ~~(b) Telehealth Practice. —~~

19 (1) The practice of veterinary medicine occurs where the patient is located at the time
20 telehealth services are provided.

21 (2) To provide veterinary care in the State of West Virginia via interstate telehealth
22 services, an individual not otherwise licensed by the board must first apply for and obtain
23 registration with the board using the application materials provided by the board and paying a fee
24 of \$300 equivalent to the veterinary application, examination, and license fee.

25 (3) To obtain registration with the board, an individual must be a licensed veterinarian in
26 good standing in all other states in which he or she is licensed and not currently under
27 investigation or subject to an administrative complaint.

28 (4) A registration with the board is subject to annual renewal on or before December 31
29 including ~~but not limited to,~~ the renewal fee of \$250 equivalent to the veterinary license renewal
30 fee and the submission of at least three patient records of West Virginia patients, if applicable.

31 (5) A veterinarian-client-patient relationship is required for providing veterinary care in the
32 State of West Virginia via telehealth services. The veterinary care professional shall perform an
33 in-person exam within the 12 months prior, and at least every 12 months thereafter, or the
34 telehealth service shall no longer be available to the patient. Such relationship exists when:

35 (A) A veterinarian assumes responsibility for medical judgments regarding the health of
36 an animal and the client who is the owner or owner's advocate of the animal consents to the
37 veterinarian's treatment plan; and

38 (B) A veterinarian, through personal examination of an animal or a representative sample
39 of a herd or flock, obtains sufficient information to make at least a general or preliminary diagnosis

40 of the medical condition of the animal, herd, or flock, which diagnosis is expanded through
41 medically appropriate visits to the premises where the animal, herd, or flock is kept.

42 (C) In the event of an imminent, life-threatening emergency, veterinary care may be
43 provided in this state via telehealth services without an existing veterinarian-client-patient
44 relationship or an in-person visit within 12 months.

45 (6) The standard of care for providing veterinary care in the State of West Virginia via
46 telehealth services by a registrant or licensed veterinarian shall be the same as for in-person care.
47 Such standard of care shall require that a veterinarian-client-patient relationship first exist before
48 telehealth services are provided and that a patient visit a veterinarian licensed in another
49 jurisdiction or licensed by the board, in-person and within 12 months of using the initial
50 telemedicine service, or the telemedicine service shall no longer be available to the patient. Only
51 in the event of an imminent, life-threatening emergency may veterinary care be provided in this

53 an in-person visit within 12 months.

75 (10) A registrant shall notify the board within 30 days of any restrictions placed upon, or
76 actions taken against, his or her license to practice in any other state or jurisdiction.

77 (11) A registration with the board does not authorize a veterinary care professional to
78 practice from a physical location within the State of West Virginia without first obtaining
79 appropriate facility registration.

80 (12) A person currently licensed by the board is not subject to registration but shall practice
81 telehealth in accordance with the provisions of §30-10-1 *et seq.* of this code and the rules
82 promulgated thereunder.
