THIRTY-SEVENTH DAY

[DELEGATE HANSHAW, MR. SPEAKER, IN THE CHAIR]

The House of Delegates was called to order by the Honorable Roger Hanshaw, Speaker.

Prayer was offered and the House was led in recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Clerk proceeded to read the Journal of Wednesday, February 15, 2023, being the first order of business, when the further reading thereof was dispensed with and the same approved.

Committee Reports

Delegate Ellington, Chair of the Committee on Education, submitted the following report, which was received:

Your Committee on Education has had under consideration:

H. J. R. 17, Providing for the election of members of the State Board of Education,

And reports the same back, with amendment, with the recommendation that it be adopted, as amended, but that it first be referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.

In accordance with the former direction of the Speaker, the resolution (H. J. R. 17) was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.

Delegate Ellington, Chair of the Committee on Education, submitted the following report, which was received:

In the absence of objection, second reference of the bill (H. B. 3353) to the Committee on the Judiciary was abrogated.

Special Calendar

Third Reading

S. B. 275, Adding State Fire Marshals to statute included with law enforcement and first responders that receive information on school safety requirements; on third reading, coming up in regular order, was read a third time.

The question being on the passage of the bill, the yeas and nays were taken (**Roll No. 163**), and there were—yeas 98, nays none, absent and not voting 2, with the absent and not voting being as follows:

Absent and Not Voting: Bridges and Hanna.

So, a majority of the members present having voted in the affirmative, the Speaker declared the bill (S. B. 275) passed.

Com. Sub. for H. B. 2062, Establish rules and regulations for e-bikes in West Virginia that more closely comport to federal law; on third reading, coming up in regular order, was read a third time.

The question being on the passage of the bill, the yeas and nays were taken (**Roll No. 164**), and there were—yeas 87, nays 9, absent and not voting 4, with the nays and the absent and not voting being as follows:

Nays: Brooks, Burkhammer, Kump, C. Pritt, Pushkin, Ridenour, Street, Vance and Ward.

Absent and Not Voting: Barnhart, Bridges, Hanna and Hite.

So, a majority of the members present having voted in the affirmative, the Speaker declared the bill (Com. Sub. for H. B. 2062) passed.

Delegate Ellington having raised a point of order regarding a title amendment for S. B. 275, the Speaker ruled the point well taken.

On motion of Delegate Ellington, the title of the bill was amended to read as follows:

S. B. 275 – "A Bill to amend and reenact §18-9F-10 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to adding State Fire Marshals to the list of persons who receive information related to school safety requirements."

Ordered, That the Clerk of the House communicate to the Senate the action of the House of Delegates and request concurrence therein.

Com. Sub. for H. B. 2515, Require agencies to develop and maintain an inventory of available services for single parents wanting to obtain degrees, secure training or reenter the workforce; on third reading, coming up in regular order, was read a third time.

The question being on the passage of the bill, the yeas and nays were taken (**Roll No. 165**), and there were—yeas 97, nays none, absent and not voting 3, with the absent and not voting being as follows:

Absent and Not Voting: Barnhart, Bridges and Hanna.

So, a majority of the members present having voted in the affirmative, the Speaker declared the bill (Com. Sub. for H. B. 2515) passed.

Ordered, That the Clerk of the House communicate to the Senate the action of the House of Delegates and request concurrence therein.

Com. Sub. for H. B. 2587, To reflect that County Sheriffs will be required to include a breakdown of the distribution of where a citizens taxes will be paid; on third reading, coming up in regular order, was read a third time.

The question being on the passage of the bill, the yeas and nays were taken (**Roll No. 166**), and there were—yeas 96, nays none, absent and not voting 4, with the absent and not voting being as follows:

Absent and Not Voting: Barnhart, Bridges, Hanna and Willis.

So, a majority of the members present having voted in the affirmative, the Speaker declared the bill (Com. Sub. for H. B. 2587) passed.

Ordered, That the Clerk of the House communicate to the Senate the action of the House of Delegates and request concurrence therein.

Com. Sub. for H. B. 2638, Authorizing certain agencies of the Department of Administration to promulgate legislative rules; on third reading, coming up in regular order, was read a third time.

The question being on the passage of the bill, the yeas and nays were taken (**Roll No. 167**), and there were—yeas 96, nays none, absent and not voting 4, with the absent and not voting being as follows:

Absent and Not Voting: Barnhart, Bridges, Hanna and Jennings.

So, a majority of the members present having voted in the affirmative, the Speaker declared the bill (Com. Sub. for H. B. 2638) passed.

Delegate Kelly moved that the bill take effect from its passage.

On this question, the yeas and nays were taken (**Roll No. 168**), and there were—yeas 97, nays none, absent and not voting 3, with the absent and not voting being as follows:

Absent and Not Voting: Barnhart, Bridges and Hanna.

So, two thirds of the members elected to the House of Delegates having voted in the affirmative, the Speaker declared the bill (Com. Sub. for H. B. 2638) takes effect from its passage.

Ordered, That the Clerk of the House communicate to the Senate the action of the House of Delegates and request concurrence therein.

Com. Sub. for H. B. 2640, Authorizing certain agencies of the Department of Environmental Protection to promulgate legislative rules; on third reading, coming up in regular order, with the right to amend, was reported by the Clerk.

On motion of Delegates Howell and Riley, the bill was amended on page 3, subsection g, line 41, by striking the period and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"with the following amendment:

On page 2, after subdivision 4.1.b., by inserting a new subdivision 4.1.c. to read as follows:

"4.1.c. This project shall give priority to structures near highly visible traffic areas, tourism corridors, and/or common open space." "

Having been engrossed, the bill was read a third time.

Delegate Espinosa requested to be excused from voting under the provisions of House Rule 49.

The Speaker ruled that the potential impact would not be direct and that the Delegate was a member of a class of persons possibly to be affected, and directed the Member to vote.

The question being on the passage of the bill, the yeas and nays were taken (**Roll No. 169**), and there were—yeas 92, nays 3, absent and not voting 5, with the nays and the absent and not voting being as follows:

Nays: Dillon, Vance and Ward.

Absent and Not Voting: Barnhart, Bridges, Hanna, Jennings and Storch.

So, a majority of the members present having voted in the affirmative, the Speaker declared the bill (Com. Sub. for H. B. 2640) passed.

Delegate Kelly moved that the bill take effect from its passage.

On this question, the yeas and nays were taken (**Roll No. 170**), and there were—yeas 93, nays 3, absent and not voting 4, with the nays and the absent and not voting being as follows:

Nays: Dillon, Vance and Ward.

Absent and Not Voting: Barnhart, Bridges, Hanna and Storch.

So, two thirds of the members elected to the House of Delegates having voted in the affirmative, the Speaker declared the bill (Com. Sub. for H. B. 2640) takes effect from its passage.

Ordered, That the Clerk of the House communicate to the Senate the action of the House of Delegates and request concurrence therein.

Com. Sub. for H. B. 2820, To provide HOPE Scholarship recipients with the ability to play sports; on third reading, coming up in regular order, was read a third time.

The question being on the passage of the bill, the yeas and nays were taken (**Roll No. 171**), and there were—yeas 73, nays 23, absent and not voting 4, with the nays and the absent and not voting being as follows:
