1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new section,
2 designated §15-12-11, relating to prohibiting sex offenders from residing near schools and
3 similarly situated facilities; and providing for exceptions.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 12. SEX OFFENDER REGISTRATION ACT.

§15-12-11. Prohibition of sex offenders from residing near schools and similarly situated

facilities; exceptions.

1 (a) *Enactment.* – Convicted sex offenders who are required to register in West Virginia are
2 prohibited from residing within 3,000 feet of the real property comprising a public or nonpublic
3 elementary or secondary school, a childcare facility, a residential child-caring agency, a children's
4 group care home or any playground, ballpark or other recreational facility utilized by persons under
5 the age of 18 years.

6 (b) *Exceptions.* –

7 (1) The provisions of this section shall not apply if the offender is serving a sentence at a
8 jail, prison, juvenile facility or other correctional institution or facility that is located within 3,000 feet
9 of a school or facility;

10 (2) The provisions of this section shall not apply if the offender is subject to an order of
11 commitment under Title 41 MCA that places the offender in a facility or institution located within
12 3,000 feet of a school or facility; and

13 (3) The provisions of this section shall not apply if the offender is a minor or ward under a
14 guardianship.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit sex offenders from residing near schools and similarly situated facilities. The bill also provides for exceptions.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
