### **Senate Bill 566**

1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new section,  
2 designated §3-1-18a, relating to imposing a limit of three terms on certain officials elected  
3 to public office in the state.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

**ARTICLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS AND DEFINITIONS.**

**§3-1-18a. Term limits of elected officials.**

1 No person seeking a public office pursuant to §3-1-16, §3-1-17, and §3-1-18 of this code  
2 may serve more than three consecutive terms for the same office. This restriction does not apply  
3 to partial terms to which an official may be appointed.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to limit the number of terms of elected officials to three consecutive terms.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
