The meeting was called to order by Mr. Ross, Co-Chairman.

The minutes of the June 11, 1995, meeting were approved.

Joe Altizer, Associate Counsel, explained the rule proposed by the Division of Natural Resources, Miscellaneous Permits and Licenses, and stated that the Division has agreed to technical modifications. He responded to questions from the Committee. Dr. Jim Crum, Wildlife Resources, and Major Bill Daniel, Law Enforcement, answered questions from the Committee.

Mr. Anderson moved that Section 7.2.21 of the proposed rule be modified to change 15 acres to 12.5 acres. The motion was adopted. The Division agreed to the modification.

Mr. Anderson moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Debra Graham, Committee Counsel, reviewed her abstract on the rule proposed by the Division of Natural Resources, Special Waterfowl Hunting Regulations, and stated that the Division has agreed to technical modifications.

Ms. Douglas moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham explained the rule proposed by the Division of Natural Resources, Special Boating Regulations, and stated that the Division has agreed to technical modifications. She distributed further modifications proposed by the Division. Major Daniel and Bert Pierce, of the Wildlife Division, responded to the Committee's questions.

Ms. Compton moved that the Committee accept the Division's proposed modifications. After further discussion, she requested unanimous consent to withdraw her motion. There being no objection, the motion was withdrawn.

Mr. Gallagher moved that the proposed rule lie over until the next meeting. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham reviewed her abstract on the rule proposed by the Division of Natural Resources, Prohibitions When Hunting and Trapping, and stated that the Division has agreed to technical modifications. Major Daniel answered questions from the Committee.

Ms. Douglas moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham explained the rule proposed by the Division of Natural Resources, Wildlife Damage Control Agents, and stated that the Division has agreed to technical modifications. Paul D. Hanson and Jim Evans, Wildlife Resources, responded to questions from the Committee.

Ms. Douglas moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham reviewed her abstract on the rule proposed by the Division of Natural Resources, Wildlife Scientific Collecting Permit, and stated that the Division has agreed to technical modifications.

Ms. Douglas moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham explained the rule proposed by the Division of Natural Resources, Rules Governing Public Use of West Virginia State Parks, State Forests, and State Wildlife Management Areas Under the Division of Natural Resources, and stated that the Division has agreed to technical modifications. Doug Baker, of Parks and Recreation, answered questions from the Committee.

Mr. Gallagher moved that Section 2.21 of the proposed rule be modified to return to the language contained in the current rule. The motion was adopted. The Division agreed to the modification.

Mr. Anderson moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham reviewed her abstract on the rule proposed by the Division of Natural Resources, Boating Regulations, and stated that the Division has agreed to technical modifications. Major Daniels responded to questions from the Committee.

Mr. Gallagher moved that Section 7.4 of the proposed rule be modified by adding the words "approved by the Director of the Division of Natural Resources" at the end of the sentence. The motion was adopted. The Division agreed to the modification.

Ms. Douglas moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham explained the rule proposed by the W. Va. State Police, Cadet Selection Process, and stated that the State Police have agreed to technical modifications. She responded to questions from the Committee. Brad Deel, attorney for the State Police, answered questions from the Committee.

Ms. Douglas moved that the proposed rule be placed at the foot of the agenda. After further discussion, she requested unanimous consent to withdraw her motion. There being no objection, the motion was withdrawn.

Ms. Douglas moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham reviewed her abstract on the rule proposed by the W. Va. State Police, State Police Grievance Procedure, and stated that the State Police have agreed to technical modifications. Mr. Deel responded to questions from the Committee.

Ms. Compton moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham explained the rule proposed by the Tax Department, International Fuel Tax Agreement, and stated that the Department has agreed to technical modifications. Mark Morton, of the Tax Department, responded to questions from the Committee.

Ms. Douglas moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham explained the rule proposed by the State Tax Division, Pollution Control Facilities, and stated that the Division has agreed to technical modifications. Mr. Montgomery responded to questions from the Committee.

Ms. Douglas moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham reviewed her abstract on the rule proposed by the Division of Labor, Commercial Bungee Jumping Safety Act, and stated that the Division has agreed to technical modifications. Chris Quaesbarth, Deputy Commissioner, responded to questions.

Mr. Buckalew moved that the proposed rule be modified to require the Division to amend its rules within two years to include any necessary changes based on experience. After further discussion, he requested unanimous consent to withdraw his motion. There being no objection, the motion was withdrawn.

Mr. Ross moved that the proposed rule lie over until the next meeting. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham explained the rule proposed by the Contractor Licensing Board, West Virginia Contractor Licensing Act, and stated that the Board has agreed to technical modifications. Mr. Quaesbarth answered questions from the Committee.

Mr. Faircloth moved that the proposed rule lie over until the next meeting. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham reviewed her abstract on the rule proposed by the Department of Administration, Purchasing, and stated that the Department has agreed to technical modifications.

Ms. Compton moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham explained the rule proposed by the Department of Administration, Parking, and stated that the Department has agreed to technical modifications. Diana Stout, General Counsel, responded to questions from the Committee.

Mr. Ross moved that Section 7.1 of the proposed rule be modified to increase the fine for parking in a handicapped area to \$100 to conform with legislation passed during the 1995 Session and to lower all other fines back to the amounts specified in the current legislative rule.

Ms. Compton requested that the question be divided.

The first part of Mr. Ross' motion regarding the fine for parking in a handicapped area was adopted.

The second part of Mr. Ross' motion regarding returning to the fines in the current legislative rule was adopted. The Department agreed to both modifications.

Ms. Compton moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham reviewed her abstract on the rule proposed by the Division of Motor Vehicles, Motor Vehicle Alcohol Test and Lock Program, and stated that the Division has agreed to technical modifications.

Mr. Faircloth moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham explained the rule proposed by the Division of Motor Vehicles, Motor Vehicle Dealers, Wrecker/Dismantlers/Rebuilders, License Services, Automobile Auctions, Vehicle Leading Companies and Administrative Due Process, and stated that the Division has agreed to technical modifications. Jane Cline, Commissioner, responded to questions from the Committee.

Mr. Ross moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham reviewed her abstract on the rule proposed by the Cable Television Advisory Board, Calculation and Collection of Late Fees, and stated that the Board has agreed to technical modifications. Don Darling, Board Counsel, responded to questions from the Committee.

Mr. Ross moved to modify Section 3.1.a of the proposed rule by changing \$5 to \$2.

Mr. Riggs moved to amend the modification by adding the words "whichever is less" to the end of the sentence in Section 3.1.b. After further discussion he asked unanimous consent to withdraw his motion. There being no objection, the motion was withdrawn.

Mr. Ross' motion was adopted.

Mr. Riggs moved to modify Section 3.1.b of the proposed rule by adding the words "whichever is less" to the end of the sentence. The motion was adopted.

Mr. Ross moved to modify Section 6.1 of the proposed rule to increase 15 days to 20 days. The motion was adopted. Mr. Darling stated that he would have to take the proposed modifications to the Board.

Mr. Ross moved that Committee amend the proposed rule in conformity with the adopted modifications if the Board does not agree to the proposed modifications. The motion was adopted.

Having voted on the prevailing side, Mr. Anderson moved that the Committee reconsider its action whereby it agreed to amend the proposed rule if the Board refused to accept the modifications adopted by the Committee. The motion was adopted.

Mr. Ross moved that the proposed rule be amended in accordance with the adopted modifications. The motion was adopted.

Mr. Ross moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified and amended. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham explained the rule proposed by the Division of Veterans Affairs, State Home for Veterans-Fiscal, and stated that the Division has agreed to technical modifications. Fritz Hubbard, Veterans Home Administrator, answered questions from the Committee.

Mr. Ross moved that the proposed rule lie over until the next meeting to allow the Committee to see the modifications proposed by the Division. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Graham reviewed her abstract on the rule proposed by the West Virginia Lottery, State Lottery Rules and Regulations, and stated that the Lottery has agreed to technical modifications. John Melton, of the W. Va. Lottery, responded to questions from the Committee.

Amendments Needed to Series 25B Special Boating Regulations

- Anawalt (McDowell County): Electric motors only. No boating allowed. <u>3,2.</u>
- 3.22. Cheat (Monongalia County): No restrictions. Motorboats must observe no-wake zones marked by buoys or posted signs. Motorboats and other vessels may not enter restricted areas marked by buoys or posted signs.
 - 3.28. Daltex Dal-Tex (Logan County): Electric motors only.
- 3.65. Mill Creek Site 10 Elk Fork (Jackson County): Motorboats are limited to a maximum of ten (10) horsepower and must observe no wake zones marked by buoys or posted signs. Boats having motors greater than ten (10) horsepower must have the propeller removed while operating on this lake.
