The meeting was called to order by Mr. Hunt, Co-Chairman.

The minutes of the April 18, 1999, meeting were approved.

Mr. Hunt told the Committee that Karen Watson, Counsel for the Office of Air Quality, would update the Committee on the rule proposed by the *Office of Air Quality-Air Pollutant Emissions Banking and Trading*, 45CSR28. She explained the program and the conflicts between the Environmental Protection Agency's directives and the state statute. She also stated that the Office of Air Quality needs more time to study the proposed rule.

Mr. Ross moved that the proposed rule be put on next month's agenda. The motion was adopted.

Debra Graham, Committee Counsel, reviewed her abstract on the rule proposed by the West Virginia Traumatic Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Rehabilitation Fund Board-West Virginia Traumatic Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Rehabilitation Fund Board, 197CSR1 and stated that the Board has agreed to technical modifications. She and Penny Hall, Division of Rehabilitation Services and Board member, responded to questions from the Committee.

Mr. Ross moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.

She and Charles Jones, Director of the Board, responded to questions from the Committee.
 - Mr. Ross moved that the proposed rule be approved as modified. The motion was adopted.
- Mr. Hunt removed from the agenda the rule proposed by the *Division of Highways-Traffic* and Safety Rule, 157CSR5.
- Ms. Graham explained the rule proposed by the *Racing Commission-Pari-Mutuel Wagering*, 178CSR5, and stated that the Commission has agreed to technical modifications. She and Lois Graham, Executive Secretary for the Commission, responded to questions from the Committee.

Having voted on the prevailing side, Mr. Ross moved that the Committee reconsider its action whereby it approved the proposed rule as modified. The motion was adopted.

Ms. Pauley explained that the rule proposed by the *Division of Highways-Transportation* of *Hazardous Wastes Upon the Roads and Highways*, 157CSR7, had been approved as modified at the last Committee meeting and that since that meeting, the Division has proposed additional modifications to the proposed rule.

Having voted on the prevailing side, Mr. Ross moved that the Committee reconsider its action whereby it approved the proposed rule as modified. The motion was adopted.
