### SERIES 10

## Definition of Surgery to Include the Use of Lasers, Ionizing Radiation, Pulsed Light and Radiofrequency Devices

### 11-10-1. General

- 1.1. Scope.- Due to technological developments in surgery over the last twenty-five years, it is necessary for the health and welfare of the citizens of the state and in the public interest to clarify that the use of lasers, ionizing radiation, pulsed light and radio-frequency devices constitute surgery.
- 1.2. Authority.- W. Va. Code 30-3-4(3) defines the practice of medicine and surgery as the diagnosis or treatment of, or operation or prescription for, any human disease, pain, injury, deformity or other physical or mental condition. W. Va. Code 30-3-7(a)(1) permits the Board of Medicine to adopt such regulations as are necessary to carry out the purposes of the article, which W. Va. Code 30-3-2 states in pertinent part is to provide for the licensure and professional discipline of physicians and podiatrists and to provide a professional environment that encourages the delivery of quality medical services within the state.

1.4. Effective date.-

### 11-10-2. Definitions.

2.1. For purposes of this rule, the following words and terms mean the following:

a. "Ablative treatment" means surgery that is expected to excise, burn, destroy or vaporize the skin below the stratum corneum.

b. "Appropriate professional standards" means comprehensive surgical training and experience, including the management of complications, and the acquisition of certification in the appropriate surgical specialties by a member board of the American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) and credentials in the use of lasers, pulsed light and radiofrequency devices, ionizing radiation, or other similar techniques.

c. "Appropriately educated and trained" means completion of training for a device and the maintenance of competency to perform procedures that may alter, transpose or damage live human skin, through documented training and experience regarding the appropriate standard of care; the fundamentals of laser operation; the physics and safety of light based medical devices; bio-effects of laser radiation on the **ove and** skin; significance of specular and diffuse reflections; non-beam hazards of lasers; non-ionizing radiation hazards; laser and laser systems classifications; and control measures.

d. "Credentials" means a minimum of sixteen hours of basic training devoted to the principles of lasers, pulsed light devices and thermal, radiofrequency and other non-ablative devices, their instrumentation, physiological effects and safety requirements, including clinical applications of various wavelengths and hands-on practical sessions with devices and their appropriate surgical or therapeutic delivery systems.

e. "Deep ablative treatment" means treatment below the dermo-epidermal junction.

f. "Dermis" means that layer of skin which provides nutrient delivery and waste disposal via diffusion through the dermo-epidermal junction.

g. "Dermo-epidermal junction" means the undulating basement membrane that adheres the epidermis to the dermis.

h. "Epidermis" means the layer of skin which is sustained and supported by the dermis.

i. "Direct Supervision" means the opportunity and ability of the supervising physician to exercise continuous control and direction over the services of a practitioner and requires the supervising physician to be physically present within the office suite and immediately available at all times to the practitioner throughout the performance of a procedure.

j. "Non-ablative treatment" means a surgery by any laser or intense pulsed light treatment or other energy source, chemical or modality that is not expected or intended to excise, burn, or vaporize the epidermal surface of the skin, including treatments related to laser hair removal.

k. "Personal supervision" means the supervising physician must be physically present in the room throughout the performance of the procedure by a practitioner.

1. "Stratum corneum" means the outermost layer of the epidermis.

- m. "Supervising physician" means a physician licensed under article, three chapter thirty and meets the appropriate professional standards.
- n. "Written protocols" means the supervising physician's order, standing delegation order, standing medical order, or other written order that is maintained on site.

11-10-3. Practice of Medicine and Surgery.

The practice of medicine and surgery for the purposes of this rule, as defined in section four, article three, chapter thirty includes the following:

- 1. Deep ablative, ablative and non-ablative treatments.
- 2. The use of lasers, ionizing radiation, pulsed light and radiofrequency devices.
- 3. The alteration of the tissue by any mechanical, thermal, light based, electromagnetic, or chemical means.
- 11-10-4. Practitioner qualifications.
  - 4.1 A practitioner shall meet and practice under the following conditions:

a. Be licensed as an aesthetician by the Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists, a person licensed by the Board of Examiners for Registered Professional Nurses or a person licensed by the Board of Examiners for Licensed Practical Nurses; or a person licensed by the Board of Optometry;

- b. Be appropriately educated and trained;
- c. Perform within his or her scope of practice;
- d. Work within established written protocols.
- 11-10-5. Supervision of practitioners for deep ablative surgery.
  - 5.1 A supervising physician may delegate the performance of deep ablative surgery to a practitioner.
  - 5.2 The practitioner shall perform deep ablative surgery under the personal supervision of the supervising physician.
  - 5.3 The supervising physician shall confirm that practitioner meets the requirements in section 4.
  - 5.4 The supervising physician is responsible for the patient's examination and treatment plan which shall be recorded in the patient's medical record prior to any treatment.
- 11-10-6. Supervision of a practitioner for ablative surgery and non-ablative surgery.
  - 6.1 A supervising physician may delegate the performance of ablative and non-ablative surgery to a practitioner.

- 6.2 The practitioner shall perform ablative and non-ablative surgery under the direct supervision of the supervising physician.
- 6.3 The supervising physician shall confirm that practitioner meets the requirements in section 4.
- 6.4 The supervising physician is responsible for the examination of the patient and for authorizing the treatment plan, and the same is to be recorded in the patient's medical record prior to any treatment.
- 11-10-7. Utilization of a practitioner as an assistant during a procedure utilizing lasers, pulsed light and radiofrequency devices, chemicals, or ionizing radiation.
  - 7.1 A physician may utilize a practitioner during the performance of a deep ablative, ablative or non-ablative surgery involving lasers, pulsed light devices, radiofrequency devices, chemicals, or ionizing radiation.
  - 7.2 The supervising physician shall confirm that practitioner meets the requirements in section 4 to assist the physician in such surgery.
- 11-10-8. Written protocols.
  - 8.1 A written protocol must provide, at a minimum:

a. A statement identifying the physician authorized to utilize the specific device and responsible for the delegation of the performance of the specified surgery;

b. A statement of the activities, decision criteria, and the practitioner shall follow when performing delegated procedures;

c. Selection criteria to screen patients for the appropriateness of non-ablative treatments;

d. Identification of devices and settings to be used for patients who meet selection criteria;

e. Methods by which the specified device is to be operated;

f. A description of appropriate care and follow-up for common complications, serious injury, or emergencies as a result of the non-ablative treatment; and

g. Documentation of decisions made and a plan for communication or feedback to the authorizing physician concerning specific decisions made shall be recorded in the patient's chart pre-operatively; and,

h. Documentation of a post-operative note shall be recorded within 24 hours after each treatment in the patient's medical record.

- 11-10-9. Equipment Safety and Registration.
  - 9.1 Equipment used for the purposes stated in this rule shall be inspected, calibrated and certified as safe to use according to the manufacturer's specifications and in compliance with applicable federal law.

11-10-10. Responsibility of Supervising Physician.

10.1 The supervising physician maintains full responsibility to patients and the Board of Medicine for the manner and results of all treatment rendered.

11-10-11. Applicability of Rule.

- 11.1 This rule does not apply to:
  - a. Hospitals, as defined in West Virginia Code 16-29B-3(e);

b. Clinics, organized in whole or in part for the delivery of health services to needy and indigent patients without charge;

c. Advanced practice nurses, advanced nurse practitioners, or certified nurse midwives, acting pursuant to a collaborative agreement with a licensed physician; and,

d. Licensed physician assistants acting pursuant to job descriptions approved by the Board of Medicine, supervised by a supervising physician(s).

Upon review of the proposed revisions to the Committee for the Purchase of Commodities and Services from the Handicapped (the committee) rules, I appreciate 1\*e committee's attempt to change and provide some clarification and transparency to sm | I businesses, but I believe more should be done.

I was adversely affected by this process, and it has taken too much time to understand the process and the result which occurred. I own a small business, White Way Inc., in Huntington, WV. Last year, I lost my contract to provide laundry/linen service for Mildrad Mitchell Bateman Hospital (MMBH) in Huntington when the committee and the Centra. Nonprofit agency (CNA) added laundry to the state-wide contract last year. I was shocked when I discovered that the CNA would be taking over our account with MMBH without having had an opportunity to bid on renewing that account. For the last ten years, we have bid on that account according to the state government's bidding process. We have been fortunate to win that account through the bidding process the last seven years. This year there was no such opportunity. The CNA presented a proposal to the committee that was accepted on the basis that it was fair and competitive and I was not given any opportunity to argue my case, nor was MMBH given and option on its chose m provider. Now, the laundry at MMBH is shipped to Hancock County.

Generally speaking, I believe the CNA was originally established to provide jobs and have a positive effect on business in West Virginia; it seems to me that the CNA, curre (dy the largest vendor in the state, is enjoying an unfair advantage over older businesses. I does not appear that there is a consistent system under which the CNA operates and r () one to whom the agency is responsible regarding business practices as well as budgel () and polices.

If other businesses in our state are to continue to compete and, hopefully thrive, it seems to me that they need to be on a level playing field with all other state contract competitors, including the CNA. Businesses need to be aware of the CNA operation a well as have an opportunity to bid against CNA in an effort to keep operating costs dow n and services provided at the highest levels of efficiency and quality for our citizens.

The taxpayers of West Virginia deserve the most return for their money, especially during these hard economic times. Financial waste must be avoided in every possible area in order to keep taxpayer's confidence high and, in many cases, to restore their confidence in government. Developing open rules of operation and public policies of which businesses and public officials are aware would be a positive step toward creating a more business friendly environment in which the CNA and other businesses could coexist within our state.

Please consider the following:

186 CSR 1 2.8 – the term "severely disabled persons" is used. "Workers with disabiliti 35" is the term used in 186 CSR4. Which term is correct? If it is severely disabled person that term should be defined.

186 CSR 1 – 3.1.4 – Requires the payment of minimum wage. The use of the prevailing wage was removed in this rule. The prevailing wage should be the standard. Contract is let by the state require payment of the prevailing wage; this should be a consistent policy. If I could offer only minimum wage to my employees. I would have no one working for me. Wages should be competitive and should be included in determining the fair mark of price.

186 CSR 1 – 3.1.5 Permits that fair market price may include a reasonable charge for overhead and profit. An independent financial audit should be required and submitted :> the committee from each non-profit workshop and from the CNA. This will assist the committee in determining the fair market value and will help the committee and the legislature assess this process. The committee should cap the amount the CNA may receive for services charges. The CNA is not here to make a profit. It was established to maintain communication between the qualified vendor, the spending unit and the committee.

186 CSR 1 - 3.6 - The fair market price subcommittee is removed. This committee should be reinstated. This subcommittee is very important because it wades through a l of the information and eventually determines the fair market price. Whether or not a service or commodity can be provided at a comparable rate is a huge factor in whether i: is placed on the state-wide contract. Much due diligence should occur in this determination.

186 CSR 1 – 4.1c This sections should reference the modification process provided in section 6 of this rule.

186 CSR 1 - 5.1.4 - CAN should be CNA.

186 CSR 3 – 3.1.2 – This section is a welcome addition, but 33% should be reduced to 10% and the term "small business" should be defined. When a small business loses ar  $\gamma$  state contract it affects it bottom line. This could result in tough business decisions which could involve workers being laid off. The loss of the laundry contract necessitated my eliminating several employee positions. Explaining to those whose jobs had to be eliminated was difficult to say the least. I understand the policy behind the statute and the rule; however, I believe the committee needs to consider the impact upon small busines is when a service or commodity is placed on the state-wide contract.

186 CSR 3 – 3.12a – This is important and will provide notice to any current vendor, about the possible inclusion of a commodity or service on the state-wide contract.

186 CSR 3 - 3.42 - This section is exactly the same as 186 CSR 1 - 7.1. 186 CSR 3 4.33 - The rule references in this section don't make any sense. Does state spending unit use the processes in 4.31 and 4.32?

186 CSR 3 5.2 – This section discusses and assignment policy. This policy should be in rule. The committee does not have the statutory authority to approve a policy.

186 CSR 3 – 6.1.2 This section is not fair to small businesses and to state spending un :3. The service or commodity is either on the state-wide contract or it is not. It is unfair of the committee to expect the state spending unit to delay an already long process to find our fill a qualified vendor is capable of producing a particular service or commodity?

186 CSR 3 – 9 The committee and the Legislature should review this section for effectiveness. The term "value added" should be defined.
