Chairman Maynard called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. A silent roll call was taken by staff and a quorum was present.

On motion of Senator Rucker, the minutes from the previous meeting were approved.

Chairman Maynard brought the following bills before the committee.

Eng. Committee Substitute for H. B. 2540 - Prohibiting the waste of game animals, game birds or game fish.

Counsel explained the bill.

Questions and answers followed.

On motion of Senator Rucker, the committee recommended HB2540 be reported to the full senate with the recommendation that it do pass; but under the original double reference first be referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

H. B. 2715 - Relating to Class Q special hunting permit for disabled persons.

Counsel explained the bill.

Questions and answers followed.

On motion of Senator Rucker, the committee recommended that HB2715 be reported to the full senate with the recommendation that it do pass; but under the original double reference first be referred to the committee on Health and Human Resources.

HHR dispensed with committee reference.

H. B. 2716 - Relating to vessel lighting and equipment requirements.

Counsel explained the bill.

Questions and answers followed.

With leave of the committee, Lt. Col. David Trader, DNR, administered the oath prescribed by Senate Rule 28a by Chairman Maynard, addressed the committee and responded to questions.

On motion of Senator Rucker, the committee recommended that HB2716 be reported to the full senate with the recommendation that it do pass.

Chairman Maynard asked Counsel to go ahead and explain an originating study resolution to the committee.

Counsel explained the resolution.

Questions followed.

With leave of the committee, Jason Webb, Recyclers Association, administered the oath prescribed by Senate Rule 28a by Chairman Maynard, addressed the committee and responded to questions.

On motion of Senator Rucker, the Committee recommended that the originating study resolution be reported to the full senate with the recommendation that it be adopted; but under the original double reference first be referred to the committee on Rules.

Senator Rucker moved to adjourn. The motion passed unanimously.
